Employment Positions

All positions require training before starting, flexibility with working hours, sitting or standing for extended periods at a time, ability to deal with a variety of weather conditions, and effectively communicating with the public. All positions vary in pay and time.

Beer Garden Attendant


In the Beer Garden, attendants are responsible for selling and collecting beer tickets, hauling beer, checking IDs, and putting on the required entrance wristbands.

Camping Attendant

Assist the camping superintendent, mark and measure campsites prior to the fair along with assisting campers with getting into their campsites and in some cases, collecting money.

Grandstand Ticket Taker

This position is responsible for opening the Grandstand gates prior to any show and staying until the end of the show, greeting patrons, scanning all tickets in for admission and out upon exit, and ensuring all tickets are valid.



Gate Admission Attendant

While welcoming patrons into the fairgrounds, attendants will also collect entrance fees, scan tickets, and provide information to fairgoers.

Attendants are required to be at least 16 years old, work well with others, preferably have some money handling experience and be available to work Thursday through Monday of fair week.

Maintenance Worker

Workers to provide physical labor on a variety of routine building and grounds maintenance projects including:

- General maintenance and repairs of State Fair facilities, grounds, and equipment
- Preparation of grounds and facilities for special events, including set-ups and teardowns
- Manure disposal including cleaning of stalls and livestock pens
- Garbage detail and emptying of trash barrels
- Use of power tools, skid loader, forklifts, etc.

This position is from May through Octobers. A Driver's License is preferred but not required. Involves some weekends.

Restroom Attendant

Restocking supplies, taking out the garbage, and cleaning to keep the restroom areas inviting to the public are the main requirements of restroom attendants.

Shuttle-Trolley Superintendent

Is responsible for the overall operations of the shuttles-trollies including hiring and training of drivers and attendants, getting tractors and trolleys cleaned and ready for operation, driving tractors and ensuring overall safety of operations while promoting a positive customer experience.

Shuttle-Trolley Driver

This requires two people per unit (tractor pulling a trolley). Typically taking turns, one person drives the tractor and the other rides in the trolley, patrolling riders.

Security & Uniformed Police Officers

These positions involve providing security and safety to the entire fairgrounds. They enforce and patrol fire lanes, gates, the grandstand, the Beer Garden, the midway, and other various locations.

Officers are required to walk throughout the fairgrounds along with handling numerous situations with the public.

Tap Haus Attendant

In the Tap Haus, attendants are responsible for selling beer, assisting the public with craft beer tastings, checking IDs, and offer an overall all positive customer experience.

Wine Pavilion Attendant

In the Wine Pavilion, attendants are responsible for assisting the public with wine tastings while providing a brief educational overview of the different variety of wines, selling wine, checking IDs, and overall all offering a positive customer experience.

Wine Pavilion Superintendant

Is responsible for the overall operations of the Wine Pavilion including hiring and training of attendants, coordinating product with wineries, set-up and cleanup of the Wine Pavilion, financial reconciliation and ensuring a positive customer experience.
